The OZCX schedule includes UCI C1, UCI Junior, and USAC age-based categories. In addition to competitive racing, OZCX features several participatory, costume encouraged events including the OZCX Kids Cross races for kids as young as 2, and the Walmart Corporate and Community Relay races — raising funds and awareness for Arkansas Children's Northwest, the local Children's Miracle Network Hospital. The weekend concludes with the spectator-friendly UCI Cyclo-cross World Cup and one of only fourteen races on the international World Cup calendar!

## LICENSING REQUIREMENTS

UCI Elite Men/U23 Men, UCI Elite Women/U23 Women must have a current International License. UCI Junior Men and Junior Women should have a current UCI ID. UCI ID's are available through USA Cycling Membership Services. Proof of citizenship required. Please allow one week for processing. An annual or one-day USAC license is acceptable for all other categories.

All racers must have a current cycling license. One-day beginner licenses are available for \$10 on-site for Cat 5/Novice racers. Youth and Junior licenses through racing age 18 are available for free through USA Cycling Membership Services. One day licenses for Categories 1-4 must be purchased online at <a href="https://www.uSAcycling.org">www.uSAcycling.org</a>. Annual USAC licenses will be available for sale at the registration booth and may be purchased at usacycling.org. **NOTE ON RACING AGE:** For the 2022/2023 season, Cyclo-cross Racing Age is your age as of December 31, 2023 (not 2022).



#### **EQUIPMENT**

No flat bars or tires wider than 33mm will be allowed in UCI events (Elite Men, Elite Women, Junior Men, Junior Women). Officials will check tires in the staging area prior to the start of the UCI races.

For racers participating in the singlespeed events, they may either ride a true singlespeed bike (one chainring and one freewheeling cog) or a bicycle with blocked gears. We encourage elite (non-UCI) racers to adhere to the spirit of the discipline.

**For USA Cycling events, USA Cycling has extremely generous bicycle regulations** and most mountain bikes, hybrid bikes, single speeds, and even beach cruisers are okay for USA Cycling Regulation CX events as long as they meet the following:

- Only a bicycle with a freewheel and one working brake on each wheel shall be used.
- Handlebars with ends, features, or attachments that extend forward or upward or that provide support for other than the rider's hands are not permitted.

#### **PACKET PICK-UP**

All pre-registered packet pickup and non-UCI onsite registration will take place at the Registration Tent, located at the front of the event venue and during the following scheduled times:

Saturday Oct 15<sup>th</sup> 7:30am – 2:30pm

Registration and packet pickup closes 30 minutes ahead of USA Cycling events and 1 hour ahead of UCI competitions.

\*Note on UCI Packet Pickup – the UCI Secretary will need to be present for packet pickup and license check.

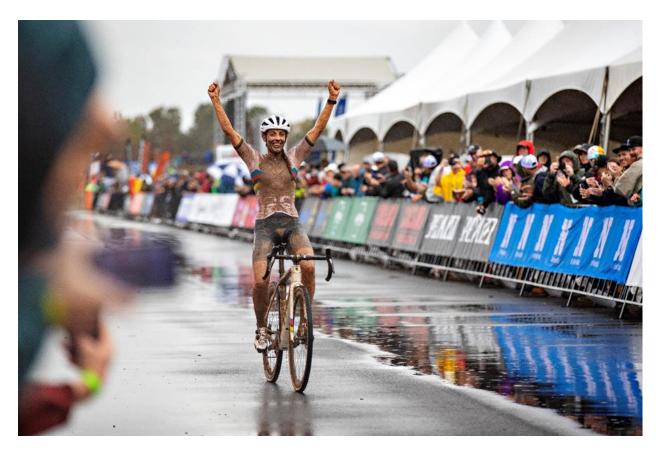
## TRAINING, INSPECTION, AND WARM-UP

The events schedule includes several opportunities for pre-ride training, inspection, and warm-up. Pre-ride times are included in the participant schedule. The course will open for inspection and warm-up approximately 15 minutes prior to each event. Officials will make announcements when the course is open for warm-up. Warming up on course during the event is strictly prohibited. Violations may result in disqualification. Because riders will be called to staging 15 minutes ahead of their race, it is recommended for riders to inspect and warm-up two waves ahead of their scheduled start time.

Helmets worn AT ALL TIMES when riding the course - failure to comply may result in rider DQ.

Note: Saturday, October 15th includes a UCI Cyclo-cross World Cup Official Training Period from 12:15 – 1:30pm. No other racers or staff are permitted on the course during the UCI Cyclo-cross World Cup Official Training Periods. This rule will be strictly enforced.





# START LINE PROTOCOL

Racers must report to the staging area adjacent to the starting grid for staging 15 minutes before the start of their race. If you arrive late, you will receive the next available position at the back of the grid.

# **CALL-UP PROTOCOL**

For USA Cycling races, **Pre-Registered** participants shall be staged in order of USA Cycling Cyclo-cross Rankings (or optional CrossResults.com rankings at organizers discretion). **Day-of** registrants will be assigned bib numbers on a first-come, first-served basis and call ups for day-of registrants are in order of time of registering.

Staging order will be prioritized based on the following criteria:

- 1) Pre-registered riders in order of rankings
- 2) Pre-registered non-ranked riders in random order
- 3) Day-of registered riders according to time of registering

Those classes consisting of only cat 4/5 men or cat 4/5 women are staged by order of registration.

UCI ELITE and JUNIOR RACES: The qualifications for start order will be: (1) The latest published UCI standings (2) Random assignment



#### **FEEDING**

No feeding is permitted during UCI races. Riders are advised to add a water bottle on their bikes if necessary. Accepting hand-ups from spectators – including bottles, cans or money – is not permitted and will result in disqualification. No alcohol is permitted on the course or in the technical area. For USAC races only, feeding is generally not permitted unless specifically authorized by the Chief Referee. If authorized, there is normally no feeding in the first two and final two laps of the race. The location of feeding will be determined by the Chief Referee in conjunction with the Race Organization (Rule 4A15).

#### **PIT & BIKEWASH**

There will be one double-sided pit on the course. Only authorized personnel are allowed access to the pit and must have their pit pass displayed at all times. Pit passes (wristbands) will be distributed at rider confirmation to each competitor (one per entrant) in UCI events (Elite Men, Elite Women & Junior Men, Junior Women). Box Assignments for UCI races only will be done by the PCP. Allocation will be available at check-in.

In non-UCI events, only those working the pit will be allowed. The pit official will have the authority to remove anyone that is interfering with the proper functioning of the pit. Please remove your equipment immediately following your race to make room for others. Bike washdown for active races is adjacent to the pit with pressure washers available.

Additional bike washing is available in team parking.

#### **LAPPED RIDERS & 80% RULE**

For UCI events - all riders lapped before the final lap must leave the race the next time they cross the finish line (UCI Rule 5.1.051). The rider will be given a placing if he or she was lapped more than halfway through the race. A rider who is lapped on the final lap shall be stopped at the end of the finishing straight line and shall be given a placing on the basis of his or her position.

Additionally, Commissaires may pull riders who are behind by more than 80% of the leader's lap time. The 80% rule is optional for Junior Men and Junior Women events, as announced in the starting line instructions during Junior competitions.

For USAC Events, the Early bell option (See USAC 4H1(d)) may be enforced, as announced in the starting line instructions.

Lapped Riders in Non-UCI Events: Lapped riders will finish on the same lap as the leaders. Riders in danger of being lapped must yield to oncoming racers and are not to interfere with their progress or trail behind them.



## **TIMING, SCORING AND RESULTS**

UCI timing and scoring will be done using active transponders and programming by Chronorace. In addition to the staff and program, a high-speed camera will also be present at the finish line.

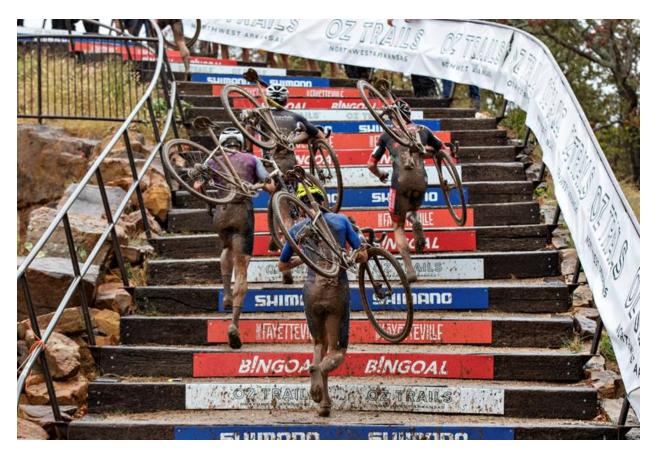
Transponder Return is located at the end of the runway on riders left where riders will exit the course (noted as **T** on map). In addition to staff, USAC timing and scoring will be done using a high-speed camera at the finish line.

## **ANIT-DOPING**

Anti-doping is under the control of USADA & ITA in accordance with UCI and USAC regulations. The location of Doping Control is located in the TV Compound, as notated on the venue map.

## **PODIUM CEREMONIES**

The podium stage is located in the event's expo, adjacent to the start/finish line. Podium ceremonies are scheduled to follow each round/wave of racing. Please see schedule for projected podium times. Podiums will be for the first three riders of any given race.





#### **PURCHASE PRO AND CLUB AREA PARKING**

Parking is very limited at the event venue. Team's and clubs NOT participating in Sunday's World Cup are strongly encouraged to purchase team space at <a href="www.bikereg.com/OZCX">www.bikereg.com/OZCX</a>. Teams may purchase up to two (2) spaces for a total of 20x20 or 20x30. Team vehicles must fit within the reserved space.

#### NO INDIVIDUAL ONSITE PARKING

Separate from paying for team space, teams and individual participants have options available to support their parking needs including complimentary Offsite Participant and Equipment Shuttles and Equipment Drop Off at the venue.

Important note: While located under 2 miles from the racecourse, participants should allow for an extra hour of travel time for shuttling to the venue.

# **OFFSITE PARTICIPANT & EQUIPMENT SHUTTLES**

For participants with minimal bikes and equipment, please utilize the complimentary offsite secure parking and shuttles at Baum Walker Stadium – 1255 S Razorback Rd., Fayetteville, AR 72701.

Located just 2 miles from Centennial Park, competitors can take advantage of complimentary parking and equipment shuttle services from Baum Walker Stadium just south of the University of Arkansas. Racers traveling North bound on Interstate 49 should take exit 60 for AR-112/AR-265/Cato Springs, then turn right onto AR-112 towards S Razorback Rd. Continue on S Razorback Rd and follow participant signage to parking.

Racers traveling South bound on Interstate 49 should take exit 60 for AR-112/AR-265/Cato Springs, then turn left onto AR-112 towards S Razorback Rd. Continue on S Razorback Rd and follow participant signage to parking.

# **EQUIPMENT/TEAM DROP-OFF**

Prior to shuttling, participants with large amounts of supporting equipment, bicycles, and/or riders are encouraged to utilize our Equipment Drop-off option, driving to the main entrance of the venue to stage bikes and equipment in the complimentary and secure Bike Valet or with fellow teammates. The Drop-off is located at - 500 S. Centennial Park Lane, Fayetteville, AR 72704.

Important note: The Drop-off area is for dropping off equipment or riders ONLY. Vehicles are limited to 10 minutes in the loading/unloading area.



After dropping off equipment, participants can then utilize the Complimentary Offsite Parking and Participant Shuttles detailed above.

# UCI COURSE DETAILS - BLACK (see map below)

Participants: UCI Elite Men, UCI Elite Women, UCI Junior Men, and UCI Junior Women

Full lap: 1.8 miles, 2.89km

Distance from Start to Pit 1 - .84 miles, 1.35 km

Pit 1 to Pit 2: .66 miles, 1.06km

Distance from Pit 2 to Finish: .26 miles, .41km

Pit 2 - Pit 1: 1.1 miles, 1.77 km

Description: 3% Pavement/97% Grass. The course will have a double pit. Course features include two (2)

flyovers, one (1) set of stairs, one (1) set of barriers, and a section of stone cobbles.

# USAC COURSE DETAILS – BLUE (see map below)

Participants: USAC Aged based categories for both Men and Women, from Junior 17/18 and older.

Full lap: 1.8 miles, 2.89km

Distance from Start to Pit 1 - .84 miles, 1.35 km

Pit 1 to Pit 2: .66 miles, 1.06km

Distance from Pit 2 to Finish: .26 miles, .41km

Pit 2 - Pit 1: 1.1 miles, 1.77 km

Description: 3% Pavement/97% Grass. The course will have a double pit. Course features include two (2)

flyovers, one (1) set of stairs, two (2) set of barriers, and a section of stone cobbles.

Special note: The USAC course uses a slight variation of the stair feature, with a shorter descent off the north side of the feature that then wraps around to the west side before rejoining at the bottom of the large, UCI only descent.



# **USAC JUNIOR COURSE DETAILS - GREEN (see map below)**

Participants: Select USAC Junior Boys and Girls categories aged 9-14 on Saturday and 9-16 on Sunday.

Full lap: 1.4 miles, 2.25km

Distance from Start to Pit 1 - .57 miles, .92 km

Pit 1 to Pit 2: .52 miles, .84km

Distance from Pit 2 to Finish: .26 miles, .41km

Pit 2 - Pit 1: .83 miles, 1.35 km

Description: 3% Pavement/97% Grass. The course will have a double pit. Course features include two (2)

flyovers, two (2) set of barriers, and a section of stone cobbles.

Special note: The USAC Junior course features two variations of the USAC course, removing the largest climb and the stair feature.

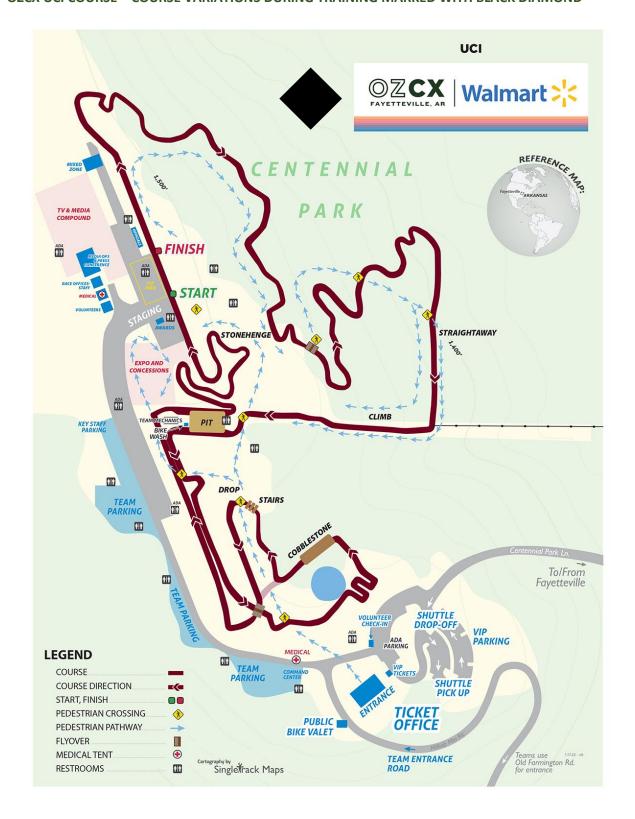
